Maths Skill: Counting

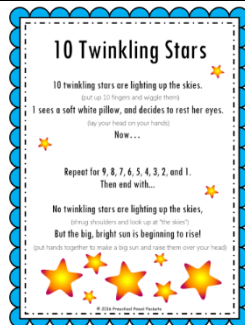
Activity:
