TASK: Write 15 of your own sums using the column method. Check your answers with a family member or using a calculator.

Triongl - Multiply 3 digits by 1 digit e.g. $437 \times 5 =$
 Sgwar - Multiply 3 digits by 2 digits e.g. $282 \times 24 =$
 Petryal - Multiply 3 digits by 2 digits e.g. $372 \times 45 =$ include decimals too e.g.
 $37.4 \times 23.5 =$

Literacy Skill Use adventurous vocabulary in your writing

Activity: Create a character portrait of a new type of superhero that would be the main character of an adventure story. Draw an image of the character and label their features using exciting and adventurous vocabulary.

Brainstorm ideas about what the character looks like, how they talk, walk or move. What are their special powers or talents? Where do they live? Think about somewhere new and exciting. Maybe a new planet? In what year do they live, past, present or future? What is special about your character? Draw an image of the character and label their features.

Maths skill: use understanding of place value to divide
TASK: Write 15 of your own sums using the garage/bus stop method. Check your answers with a family member or using a calculator.

Triongl - Divide a 2 digit number by a 1 digit number e.g. $48 \div 4 =$
 Sgwar - Divide a 3 digit number by a 1 digit number e.g. $248 \div 4 =$
 Petryal - Divide a 3 digit number by 1 and 2 digit numbers e.g. $248 \div 4 =$
 $260 \div 13 =$

Literacy Skill: use techniques in planning writing, e.g. mindmapping, sequencing, placemat activities.

Activity: Plan an adventure story that has a clear 5-step process. E.g. Beginning, Development, Problem, Resolution and Ending.

Using the story plan of your choice plan an adventures story by thinking about what would happen at each stage of your story. You can create a bubble map, mind map or story mountain.

Maths skill: estimate the length of time everyday activities take to complete

TASK: Create the following table and fill it in by thinking of an activity, estimating how long it will take and then time it to see how close you were.

You can use the stopwatch on your phone/fit bit to time yourself.

Literacy Skill: Use adventurous vocabulary in your writing

TASK: Research the temperatures of two cities online and work out the difference between them. If you need to, you can draw a number to help you calculate the difference.

City 1 Temperature	City 2 Temperature	Temperature difference

Challenge - Include cities with negative temperatures.

Literacy Skill: Edit and proofread your own work and redraft your work to show progression

Activity: Up level your story.

Look over your work from the previous day. Time for you to be the teacher! Look for errors in spelling or grammar. Have you used a range of punctuation? Use a highlighter or different colour pen/pencil to show the things that you need to improve. Can you edit words so that they are more adventurous? Find alternative words to make your story more exciting and action packed.

Maths skill: recall multiplication facts

TASK: Write 20 mixed tables questions and answer. Too easy? Time yourself answering them and see if you can beat your score!

Triogl - For tables 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 10.

Sgwar - For tables 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8 and 10.

Petryal - Multiplication tables up to 10 x 10.

Literacy Skill: Revise and improve writing,
